## Licensed Contract Sick Leave- Care of Others

ARTICLE 11 SECTION 1 SUBD. 5

Subd 5. Up to 20 days of aAccumulated sick leave may be used in a contract year to allow the teacher to provide necessary care for the serious or critical illness of a spouse, parent, step-parent, adult child, sibling, or grandparent.

5.1 Up to 15 days of accumulated sick leave may be used in a contract year to allow the teacher to provide necessary care for the serious or critical illness of a member of the teacher's household not listed in Subdivision 5. Up to five (5) additional days of compensatory leave may also be granted due to illness of a member of the teacher's household not specified in Subdivision 5 with the approval of the Human Resource Department. No more than 20 total days may be granted.

# SCSP Contract Sick Leave- Care of Others

ARTICLE 10 SECTION 5 SUBD. 1.9

Up to one hundred twenty (120) hours of a **A**ccumulated sick leave may be used in a fiscal year to allow the employee to care for and attend to the serious or critical illness of his/her spouse, parent or member of the employees' household. These days when used are deductible from accumulated sick leave.

#### EA Contract Sick Leave- Care of Others

#### **ARTICLE 10.1.4.4**

Family Leave. Up to twenty (20) days of a Accumulated sick leave may be used in a work year to allow the employee to care for and attend to the illness or injury of his/her adult child, spouse, sibling, parent, mother-in-law, father-in-law, grandchild, grandparent, stepparent or member of employee's household, unless otherwise in accordance with Minnesota Statute § 181.9413. These days when used are deductible from sick leave, but will not reduce the annual availability of personal leave as described in 10.1.4.3. A day equals the amount of hours an employee is regularly scheduled to work during the leave.
